

FROM WEBMASTER JIM KERBER




Our website recently went through a major transition that you never noticed. Shortly after writing my article for the previous edition of Crosstalk I was notified that our web hosting company decided to go out of business. They were talking about closing all operations within 2 or 3 weeks. This started our search for a new host company, transferring our domain name AND at the same time relying on our website for entry registration for our fall car show, Earnhardt Chevy Stampede. After looking at several hosting companies we chose GoDaddy and initiated the transfer process. We were able to keep the old website in place and running while transferring files to GoDaddy and testing the website until the

domain name transfer was complete in early October with no downtime. I wish to thank our Board for making quick decisions to accomplish this transfer. Our previous host company, BaNet, was very cooperative in maintaining hosting services during this transition and expediting the domain name transfer. GoDaddy provided great technical support to make this transition as seamless as possible.

Howard is hard at work developing a new, user friendly website with improved current technology features and significant security improvements. 
