When I look back on this year in club, I'm struck by how much was accomplished! The Future Committee was appointed in January and worked into June to offer four recommendations that were ultimately approved by club members:

Adopt the Chandler Chamber of Commerce for General Membership meetings

Move the fall Chevy car show to Downtown Chandler Define the Activity Team concept to address the growing number of members and set guidelines for future review Confirm Earnhardt Chevrolet as the club sponsor and understand the relationship is a work in progress

Then in July we started looking at the corporation status of Corvette Club of Arizona, Inc. as concerns the IRS. Unfortunately no records were ever found in the archives for communication with the IRS since the present entity was incorporated in 2002. The club has voted to terminate the present corporation and setup a new corporation, Corvette Club of AZ, Inc., as of January 1. 2018. The Arizona Corporation Commission has already approved the new corporation and the application to apply to t IRS for tax exempt status as a 501 C (7) social club will be mailed the first week of January.

In addition to all this, members participated in 9 drivers, 2 car shows, 2 highway cleanups and 28 other events, This is an ACTIVE club and I'm so glad to be a part of it. Special thanks to all those who organized and hosted - you are the heartbeat of this group!

Looking forward to even more fun events in 2018!

There were many new challenges that had to be overcome by moving this venue from **Earnhardt to Downtown Chandler including:** working and meeting with Chandler City officials for the required permitting and road barricades, working around the new street construction on Commonwealth Avenue, devising new car parking layouts by car class to match the available parking slots,



competition with several conflicting Car Shows on that same day, and some missed advertising opportunities.






