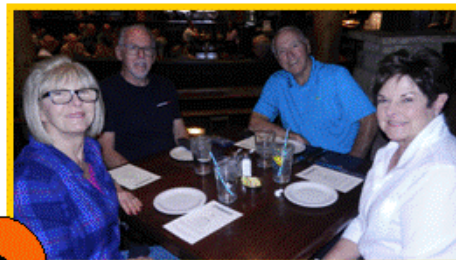

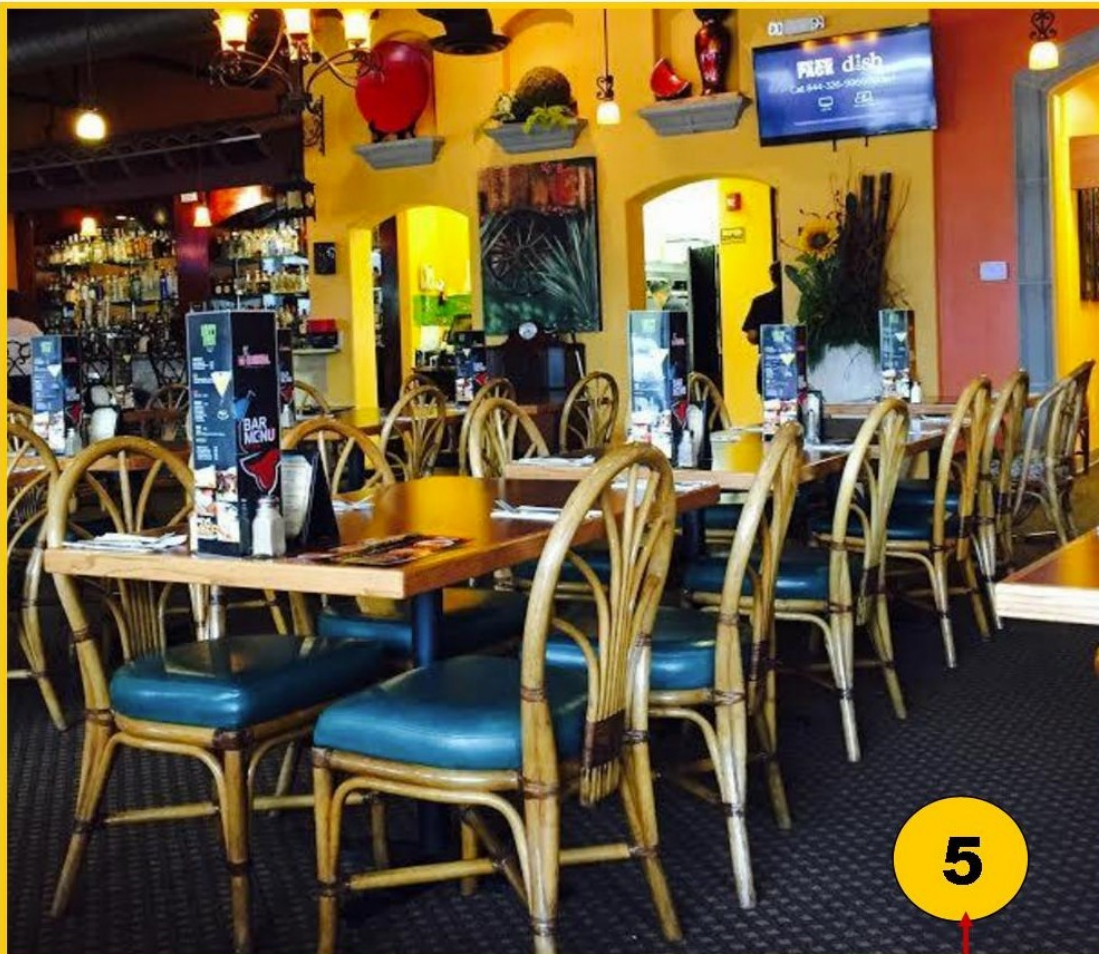

Packages from Home

On February 9th, 18 CCA members attended a Packages From Home (PFH) Packing Party.

Packages From Home is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization whose mission is to send care and comfort packages to our military personnel stationed around the world, as well as to facilitate activities that elevate morale of all veterans.

Here's the story behind this great organization:

On 9/11 Christian Lewis watched the Twin Towers fall and enlisted in the US Army infantry the next day. His mother, and Packages From Home Founder, Kathleen Lewis, sent him care packages while he was first deployed to Iraq in 2004. Christian said receiving packages from home not only provided needed and familiar items but also reminded him he hadn't been forgotten-that there were people back home supporting him. Unfortunately, Christian was the only soldier in his squad receiving packages and letters from home. Kathleen rallied her closest friends and decided to "adopt" Christian's entire squad. The group began shipping packages to all of the troops in Christian's unit and Packages From Home was born!

After a very successful packing party, President Tom Palmer presented a Check for \$2,100 to PFH reps, Meaghan and Olga, both former marines. With a new system in place, CCA members were able to pack a record 225 packages and even found time to write some letters to include in the packages.

We followed up with a great lunch at Marissa's Mexican Seafood restaurant. Special thanks go to all who attended this very satisfying event.



Ceramic Coatings

I know most of us car nerds have heard about Ceramic Coatings by now. Is it the real deal or snake oil? As your newsletter editor, I am afforded the opportunity to offer car related informational topics as well as, hopefully entertaining news. At the age of 16, my first real job I ever had was cleaning cars for a police officer, who operated a car cleaning business on the side. Growing up in Iowa, bailing hay was a seasonal job thankfully, so I don't think it counts. I've been cleaning cars most of my life. I have always appreciated clean, shiny objects. If you know anything about me by now, you know I like car shows. At one period in my life, I owned a 70' t-top Corvette and a 50th Anniversary Corvette. And I showed them both. Let me tell you, it takes a lot of effort to meet my demands of show worthiness cars. To help offset the cost of my passion and some might say affliction, I became a distributor of a waterless car wash/polish product that helped me get the best results, with the least amount of effort. I still use this product today as it works great on all surfaces.

Fast forward a few years later, I got to hearing and reading and watching information about this coating that gets applied to your car's paint that acts like a thin layer of glass, I became more and more interested. Then I find out you can put it on your painted or chrome wheels to keep the brake dust off of them and keep them shining. You can also apply it to your windows to make them shine and help shed water. What about your stereo face or infotainment screen? Yep. There is one more application I know of but I'm gonna leave that for later in the article.



The question I most hear asked about ceramic coating is, how long will it last. I am going to present the 4 main paint protectants being used these days. You will be able to compare the after-effects of each sealant and how long you can expect them to last. Of course, how you drive, wash, store your car has a major effect on how long any sealants work. I personally have applied ceramic coatings to 4 different vehicles and I am prepared to do 2 more because I believe it is a good product to help protect your car from bird droppings, UV rays, splattered bugs and provide outstanding hydrophobic properties (sheds water) and easy cleanup!

What is your personal method of cleaning your favorite car? Soap and water with a hose and bucket? Buy the \$15/month unlimited car washes from your neighborhood car wash? You know, the one with the roller drum of brushes and mops. What if you could just hose your car off and use a white towel to wipe it dry, and the towel stays white? Does that sound intriguing? Post ceramic coating, I use a pressure washer with just water, to remove any bugs from the front end, mirrors, windshield and to clean the wheels and tires off. Then I can use a cotton towel to wipe down the paint, and use window cleaner on the wheels. That's it! You can "boost" the shine of your vehicle by applying ceramic or graphene booster for those days you want that extra shine. Of course you can apply a film of PPG (similar to clear bra) over your whole car too. There's even paint protection that I saw at Barrett Jackson this year that can heal itself with the use of a heat gun



There are a lot of products on the market now offering different protections for different lengths of time and results. They offer anywhere from 6 months to 5 years worth of protection.



Ceramic coating

If you are thinking that you have purchased your last Corvette, truck, boat, airplane, wouldn't you want to protect it the best way you can? Possibly you want the best chance of improving your trade in or resale value? You might consider applying ceramic coating yourself or hire a reputable detailer to do it for you. I myself am more of a DIY'er so I read, watched and learned what I could to help shine and protect my Corvette. I am attaching several videos which I believe are objective and informational. The first one compares the 4 different sealants that I spoke about earlier. The second video shows examples of the protection you can achieve through ceramic coating. The third video explains how you can apply ceramic coatings to bumpers, headlights, dashboards, and so on. The last video is an independent view on ceramic coating your car.

You will notice the videos are describing and testing a particular product. I, in no way am recommending this product because of any financial or any other kind of reward for myself. I **DO** recommend the practice of applying coating to your vehicle's surfaces. It happens that I have used this product, Avalon King Armor Shield so I am familiar with it's application and results. I have also used Adam's Polishes Graphene Ceramic coating. Both of the products performed flawlessly with outstanding results. The application of the coating is the easy part. The prep involved will depend on the condition of what you are trying to protect. Even if your surface is in good condition, you can expect at least 3-12 hours of prep to achieve your best results.



With car season in full swing, now is the time to get that ride of yours looking the best it can be. I would be happy to answer any questions that you may have about ceramic coatings or applying them to the best of my ability. In the words of Barb Bassett, "give it a try." Oh, and the other application I mentioned earlier, you should see how it works on your stainless appliances!

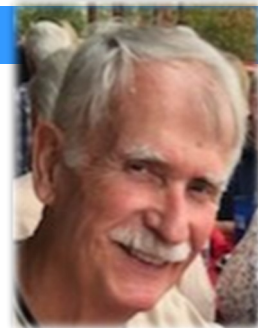
