

Sonoita Wine Tour

The day couldn't have been any better as CCA members travelled from Chandler by dawn's early light to meet up with others in Casa Grande, all on the way to taste wine in southern Arizona. This area of Arizona is a fairly new viticulture since the elevation is about 4,000 feet and the summer rains are plentiful.



Twenty-one CCA members followed a route designed by Heinz and Eva Platten, with Dennis and Charlotte Hughes sweeping at the rear, in case anyone got lost. Going behind and along the west side of the Saguaro National Park, we had a rough to smooth roadway going through several Indian Reservations. At Tucson we left sprawling civilization and joined up with twisty, hilly roads that took us to Sonoita/Elgin areas. Since Eva and Heinz live in Casa Grande, they were great leaders on this driver.





Our first stop was at Dos Cabezas WineWorks in Sonoita, a family-owned winery with a small team of wine workers who grow grapes and make wines in southern Arizona. Todd and Kelly Bostock are husband and wife team who were named among The San Francisco Chronicle's "10 Winemakers to Watch for 2015". We lunched on seasonal, wood-fired pizzas with our wine tasting on their newly renovated outdoor patio.

Afterwards, we went across the street to the Sonoita Inn, where Katy had our keys ready for us, so that we could quickly check into our rooms and continue our wine tasting tour at Wilhelm Family Vineyards in Elgin. Karyl and Kevin Wilhelm met in Saudi Arabia while serving in the U.S. Air Force during the Gulf War. Kevin was a fighter pilot and Karyl worked in aeromedical evacuation. In 2008, they opened this winery and have been producing award -winning wines every since. They graciously prepared the backroom with tables, glasses and wine ready for our group. Karyl described the process of growing grapes and creating wines in southern Arizona. Even though Kevin is a fourth-generation farmer and Karyl is a certified winemaker and biomedical engineer, they faced many challenges.







Along the way, we thought it would be fun to figure out just how many Corvettes it takes to form a Question mark! Looks like it takes 8! Let me explain that we were on our way to our 3rd Winery. Kevin

The next stop was at Flying Leap Vineyards & Distillery, which was founded in 2010 by 3 friends. They initially envisioned a small-scale wine grape farming operation in Willcox, AZ. However, as their sales soared due to growing demand for the company's wines, they expanded their business with 3 major vineyards and purchased a winery in Elgin. In Elgin, we were greeted warmly by Gabriel, sommelier in the wine tasting room and by Karen, sommelier in the distilled spirits tasting room.

Then it was time for our "Wine & Dine" at Elgin Winery and Distillery, which was founded in the early 80's and is the most and highest awarded craft distillery in the west. When we arrived, several tables were already set up in the tasting room for our group. Each table was prepared for dinner, 6 mini-courses paired with wines. Our host was Gary Ellam, winemaker and spirits maker, who regaled us with funny jokes while serving food, describing the wines and the history of the winery. Our servers were family members and the chef, Gary's daughter Kathryn, graced us with an appearance after the meal, where she was met with well-deserved applause. In addition to the meal, we each received a delicious marzipan-filled croissant to take home for breakfast.





After our special, chef inspired dinner, we returned to the Sonoita Inn. This hotel was originally built as a "retirement home" for Secretariat, that famous race horse! Although Secretariat never lived there, the structure still remains, now as a hotel for travelers. With a big, two story central gathering place and rooms off the hallways, there was plenty of space for conversation (and continuing wine tasting).

It was so good to have long time members getting to know newer members on this driver. There was something for everyone.... even a scavenger hunt for passengers to pass the time away. You may not know that porta-potties come in many colors. Also, that there are four or more reservations between Chandler and Sonoita.

Our Corvettes were riding a bit lower on the way home. Many bottles were tasted and many made their way back to our homes. Thank you all for joining us and keep this trip in mind for the future! Plattens/Hughes

Detailing tips

I wanted to share a personal story of why I love ceramic coating. There happens to be paving work going on Warner Rd. between 101 and Rural Rd. I thought that I had avoided that area long enough in our C6. However, if you zoom in (hold ctrl and scroll the mouse wheel) on the picture to the left, you will see what happens to your vehicle when there is fresh tar around. ARRRGHH! Good thing that the paint is sealed from tar, road grime, bird poop, and UV rays. It's nothing to worry about really when your paint is sealed and you have a waterless car wash product that removes it all from your Vette. I simply dampened a microfiber towel with tap water, wring it out, sprayed <u>Dri-Wash</u> on the towel and wiped it off with a clean microfiber towel. EASY PEASY! No harsh chemicals, WD-40 or any specialty product. Now you can zoom in on the picture on the right and see the results of this method. SPOTLESS, and NO SCRATCHES! Then I threw the towel away so that I wouldn't put in with the laundry. I used this same method when I returned to our car from working at Corvettes in the Park and found like 5 bird bombs on it. **ARRRGHH AGAIN!** Simply wet the towel, spray the product on and wipe off. This method and product works great for removing bugs from the front of your car, outside rearview mirrors and windshield! Just let it dry to a glaze on your glass and use a new or clean towel to wipe clean. This is the same product that I used to be a distributor for 20 years ago and I still use today. Ridin' on a Boxcar with My Sister **Bob Bassett**

This is a short story about my Mom, Muriel Olive Bassett, nee POCOCK, born July 9, 1921, in Unity, Saskatchewan. The first notable thing about Mom was that she was the seventh daughter in a row. No doubt a small disappointment to Grandpa, but he finally got his son with number eight. Growing up with older sisters provided a lot of opportunities to get involved with things they shouldn't have been doing, and Mom was often the slowest one running away, and, of course, the one that got caught. Things like raiding the neighbour's garden and cherry tree seemed to be annual events.

In 1931, when she was ten, one of her friends moved from Unity to Saskatoon, about 150 miles away. One day Mom and her sister, Gwen, (age twelve), decided to go visit their friend. Having no other form of transportation, they went down to the CPR rail yard and climbed up on top of a boxcar. They sent a note back home tied to the dog's collar that said: "We're fine. We've gone to Saskatoon!" Luckily, a farmer saw the girls on the boxcar, recognized them and sent a message to Grandpa. They made it as far as Wilkie about 35 miles away, where they were met by the local RCMP constable. Grandpa and one of my uncles drove there as fast as they could, to find the girls having tea and cookies with the constable's wife. The girls were grounded, of course, and got no Saturday nickel for a month, but all their friends wanted to hear their story.

During her 70+ years in Richmond, Mom served many service organizations and public bodies, including Caring Place Committee, Family Court Committee, Seniors fall Prevention Committee and many others. She served as a Trustee for the Richmond School Board, was a columnist for the local newspaper and while in her seventies, taught Jazzercise for Seniors. She was a prize-winning gardener and an active participant in local politics. She also did a short stint as a model and even appeared in a CVS ad in People Magazine. In 2010, Mom was chosen as a Torch Bearer for Richmond in the 2010 Vancouver Olympics. She was the oldest Torchbearer and the youngest was eight. In 2012, she was awarded the Ethel Tibbits Women of Distinction Award, for her many years of community service. For her 99th Birthday, during Covid, she received 99 Birthday cards from family and friends. Last year, on her 100th birthday, we did an outdoor party with 45 family members present. To top it off, she received congratulatory letters from Queen Elizabeth II and the Governor General of Canada and a very special and personal letter of congratulations and thanks for her service to the community from the mayor of Richmond. Way to go Mom!
