NCCC Governor's Report

From Bill Doherty, VP of Competition.

The top 15 list was read.

Competition Awards: Gold has doubled in price. Deb will be discussing money for top competitors.

We will not be having gold rings for competitors for 2023.

Electric Vehicles: We asked for insurance advice. If a car is a Corvette, it will be allowed. We are not going to restrict E-Rays. Regions may decide on a club-by-club basis if they will allow EV's at their events.

E-Ray will be class PP the same as Z06. We will determine if it needs a separate class later.

Rule changes:

Governors' names and addresses on flyers for car shows are not needed.

C-8 engines will not be judged in best of show for Concourse.

FTD's will have to have at least 2 entrants to earn FTD per class. The second FTD will require 3 entrants, And the third FTD will require 4 entrants..

This will help new drivers. If someone is abusing this privilege it will be up to the event chairman to decide if it is being used properly.

Funkhanas in a car; If it is very low speed or stationery, no helmet required. Funkhanas will be scored the same as a rally.

Clarifications:

Clarification on language of HPDE event should be changed to NCCC event or Speed event because the connotation of HPDE is more of a training event. This was tabled and will be gone over again in the Fall.

Clarification in Chapter 11 with the language "wave by" should be changed to "point by" was approved.

Clarification about voting for your own car at car shows. Clubs may decide if participants may or may not vote on their own cars at car shows. A protest concerning this was withdrawn.

The rule book will be back online this week.

The team had to have consensus on the content(s) for each bag and the team scoring the highest number of correct answers within the time limit won.

Game #2 - Name that TV Show from Yesteryear. Short sound bytes of the theme (depending on the theme tune, 10 - 33 seconds) from 15 TV Shows from yesteryear ('60s and '70s) were played. The teams had to reach consensus on TV show names and the team scoring the highest number of correct answers within the time limit won.

Game #3 - Construct the Tallest Building: Each team was provided eight sheets of plain white paper, a pair of scissors, a roll of scotch tape and a paper plate. Using the materials provided, the team had to construct a free standing structure within the time limit. The team with the tallest standing building (had to stand unsupported for at least one full second) wins.

It was a thrill to see everyone so engaged, minds thinking, watching the facial expressions, hearing all the laughter and belly laughs - it was indeed a fun packed evening! **Thank You** to everyone for the wonderful feedback; it was our pleasure to host this Game Night and we look forward to the next one!
