
In November we added 3 new members. Please welcome Dick Bond & Jerry Jordan and Dennis Cox.

GM's Christmas present this year is no surprise: The 2020 Corvette has been named <u>Motor Trend's Car of the Year</u>. It really couldn't have been any other car, as nothing else has a chance of matching the extraordinary leap in technology we see in the new Corvette. Quoting Motor Trend: "[Chevrolet] dialed it, massaged it, honed it, crafted the new 'Vette to the point of the nearly impossible. The eighth-generation



car will bring people into dealerships who previously would never have come in. The mid-engine Corvette is a game-changer, an inflection point, and a reminder that when Americans truly set our minds to a task, lookout. For soon you'll be standing on the moon - or driving the sports car equivalent thereof."



And another no brainer: Even though production hasn't yet begun, all 2020 Corvettes have already been spoken for. GM North America president, Barry Engle, said GM plans to build 40,000 examples of the 2020 Corvette next year, all of which have already been sold. This includes both the Coupe and the Convertible!

Chevrolet is reportedly cooking up a 900 hp, all-wheel-drive hybrid version of the new mid-engine Corvette that would be the most powerful GM car ever. Now Hennessey Performance has revealed plans to offer a 2020 Corvette build powered by a 1,200 hp twin-turbocharged version of the new 6.2-liter V8.

I haven't had the chance to see, feel and touch one yet, but am looking forward to Barrett Jackson this year as I'm pretty sure they will have one, or perhaps even two on display. How good would it be to see the new convertible up close and personal?

In the meantime, how about this plate as a Christmas present to yourselves?




