President's Message

Once again, we were forced to cancel the February combination Dinner and Membership Meeting at the Oakwood Ballroom due to increased COVID-19 concerns. In order to maintain the continuity of our Club Member meetings, the Board has decided to move forward with a March 4th Membership Meeting with the expectation that because COVID-19 vaccines have now become available to those in our age group, more CCA Members will attend. At this point with almost a year of lockdowns and self-isolating we therefore have little choice if we want to continue to have meetings where we can get together to enjoy each other's company and continue moving forward into 2021.

<u>Update: CCA Meeting Venue Search</u>

At the end of January, we met with First Credit Union (FCU) to inspect the completed conference room and sign-off on our acceptance document along with our NCCC Proof of Insurance Rider. The Room is not as large as the old Chamber of Commerce Room and it is set up Classroom-style with long narrow tables and nice chairs behind them that will seat about 48 people for some of our monthly Membership Meetings. This will still require us to find a larger space for when we are at our peak of 50-80 Members in attendance. Unfortunately, at this time due to COVID-19, there will be room capacity restrictions which will drastically cut down the maximum of 48 persons until further notice from the staff at FCU.

Therefore, we will still be looking for yet another space that can hold our larger in-season Meetings. To that extent, and when any COVID-19 restrictions are no longer in-place, we will be looking into offering different Dinner/Membership Meeting combinations where the room is offered at no charge if dinner is provided - similar to the one that was so successful at the Oakwood Ballroom.

The Corvettes in the Park Car Show was cancelled due to spacing requirements and the additional cost of a COVID-19 remediation plan required by the City of Chandler. We are hoping that COVID-19 will not be an issue for the October Chevys in the Park Car Show, but we also didn't dream that we would be "stuck in gear" while the last three Car Shows had to be cancelled!

As restrictions loosen up, we welcome any and all suggestions from the Membership for Drivers, or other events that can be put on to keep us way more active than last year. Now that the weather is getting nicer, let's get creative and come with some open-air gatherings of any size to help get us past all of these restrictions in the months to come.

Also, a big thanks to Roc for his charity event at PIR where we followed behind a Pace Car for five laps around the track on Feb 27th.

The decision to request a vote from the membership for a donation to Packages from Home was driven by the fact that we were unable to hold any fund raisers due to the (COVID-19 related) cancellation of our last TWO car shows (last fall and this spring) In addition, Packages from Home relies heavily on our club's support twice every year for the last several years from our car show registration revenues.

With regard to the affirmative vote from the membership to donate \$1,200 to Packages from Home, I believe this was a Club first, in that where we would normally vote at a CCA Membership Meeting, we sent out a vote by email donation notice instead, due to COVID-19 virtually closing down our Meetings. We will also be addressing this issue when we do our review of the CCA SRP's to allow for such a deviation in the future.

As far as the voting process is concerned, emails were sent out to every CCA Member where we requested EACH CCA Member to send their vote to two specific Board Members as a verifiable method to properly certify and assure that the vote count was accurate.

In any case, here are the results of the email voting for PFH:

Of our ~120 Members, over 50% responded to the email vote request. Of that 50% who voted, 75% had voted to the affirmative and 25% that said no.

With the email voting complete, we were therefore able to present a check to Packages from Home at the Packing Party on February 10th where we also packed over 160 boxes to mail out for our Troops!

Thanks to Neil & Tina Pivar for taking over the PFH Packing Party event for the Bassett's who are still locked-down in Canada.

Packages from Home

For 2021, on February 3 and February 10, small groups of CCA members met at the Packages From Home facility in Glendale to create boxes to be shipped to Military

Service members identified by Packages From Home (PFH). Each group converged at the PFH facility. Bob Bassett is the traditional coordinator for this event, but since everyone is under COVID-19 restrictions, Bob is stuck in Canada. Tina Pivar, with Neil's help, took the reins this year to fill in to coordinate the groups. The restrictions mandated we wear face masks and limited the number CCA members who could participate each day.

PFH's goal for each day was to have us assemble 100 packages to be sent off to servicemen and women deployed around the globe. Each service member gets one of each box – a Food box and a Hygiene & Recreation Box. Our groups worked well to knock off 100 packages in the first group, then 150



packages on the 10th. By the time we finished, the plastic bins you see in the photos were nearly empty. They had each been filled to the brim with items mostly donated to PFH from many supportive business and individuals. The pallets of completed boxes were overflowing.

Since 2004, Packages From Home has proudly shipped over 115,000 PFH care packages overseas, comprising roughly 282,000 lbs of bulk food, hygiene and recreation items. They have also provided transitioning, at-risk, and homeless

veterans with 65,633 lbs of food, hygiene & recreation items and served over 575,000 individual service members. Each box also was packed with a personalized note from a school-age boy or girl and a Thank You note from CCA.

At the end Brad Ryan presented the \$1200 check from CCA to Packages From Home.

After each event, the team headed about 20 minutes north to Ajo Al's Mexican Restaurant. We got started with drinks, chips & salsa, and then ordered from their wonderful menu. The servers



did a great job of serving. And we had a good opportunity to visit and get to know each other better. In the end, the food was excellent, the event was inspiring. Both were well worth the drive.

I had to re-install my seat belt that I removed while I was painting before installing my soft top. The event was a great incentive to continue my repair work on this rescue Vette.

It was a wonderful day to take a long drive in a Corvette without air conditioning. Traffic on the I-10 through the Tunnel was surprisingly congested...I don't get out much these days.

I joined two members at the Circle-K on Avondale, one with a beautiful red C7. I had a nice chat with the other driver and I mentioned how much I love his Ceramic Matrix Gray Metallic C8. Last month, I bought the same 1/18th scale model from Miasto. Hopefully, I will drive a full scale car soon.

While we were waiting for the others, we were entertained by the Camaro Club. I think there were 30-40 high performance cars headed to the track. From the stop sign at Avondale Boulevard and Southern Avenue to the Salt River Bridge, it was like a stop light grand prix. So many cars seemed to have over 600 HP. I expect it was more exciting than the track laps.

As our group approached the track entrance, we experienced a traffic back-up. It took about 45 minutes of stop-and-go traffic to get to the track entrance about a half mile away. Roc gave me my ticket and asked me to wait with the other members until we would drive onto the track together.


As I mentioned, it was cool day. My Vette ran between 210 and 220oF all day, from 80 mph to the stop-and-go. When I shut off the engine, the overflow tank that I installed from the 1962 Corvette relieved pressure and spilled some coolant onto the parking area.

An official noticed and told me I was not allowed to drive my car on the track. I understood his position, and I did not want to embarrass the Club by telling him that it was just because I shut -off the radiator fan. I am still puzzled why steam was coming out of the radiator to the catch tank (insert grey haired guy with hands up emoji here). He directed me to the track bypass route. My biggest regret is that I did not get to do the video of the club Corvettes on the track. I bought a car-cam so I could record the event. I thought everyone at the event would donate \$20 or more to the club to get a thumb drive with their car circling PIR. Oh well.



My Vette was running poorly as I left the track. The engine stalled twice until I got onto the Salt River Bridge. The heat-sink of the 283 cubic inch Corvettes can be a challenge for the driver. My car runs a little rich. The fumes can be annoying when idling with a tail wind. The original 2x4's use a lot of fuel. I installed a "street cam" that seems to aggravate this characteristic. Air flow is always the solution to this problem. I have been looking for a shop that has a chassis

dyno with emissions capability with no success. I am unsure how I could change the jets in the carburetors to reduce the problem even if I have the emissions data.

I had a great drive home because the weather was wonderful and 2087 ran perfectly. I parked in the driveway, just in case, and everything was normal. I checked the coolant levels and the radiator was full and the catch tank was an inch above empty.

The conclusion to this experience is, my Vette and I find 45 minute waiting for anything is annoying and not worth the wait. I guess getting old makes us cranky.

To my Cars & Coffee friends,

Again I am reaching into the recesses of my mind to come up with another "odd ball" story:

Around 1964, I was cruising the back roads of San Diego with a friend in my 1957 Thunderbird when we noticed the water temperature rising. I pulled over and we looked under the hood to see if there was an issue. There was, and it was a pin hole in the radiator causing it to lose fluid. I questioned whether we could make it to the closest auto parts store to get a bottle of Bar's radiator stop leak (we were some distance from town). My friend said "not to worry, I have the solution" and pulled out a pack of cigarettes. He told me that he had heard, if you field strip a cigarette and put the tobacco in the radiator, it will plug up any leak. So, we tried it and it worked like a charm.
