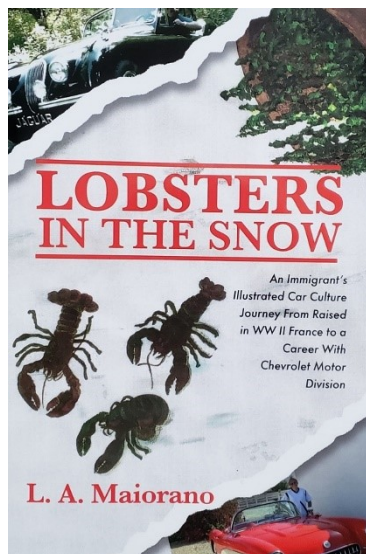
Lobsters in the Snow

Flag Gauge

The following is a sample story from my book, Lobsters in the Snow.

Flag gauge

When I bought my first 1957 Corvette, back in 1990, one of the several reasons I liked the '57 was the styling. I appreciated the design, including the coves, and the added touch of crossed flags in the coves on certain '57 Corvettes. With the availability of the optional fuel injected motor, a fuel injection script and crossed flags were added in the coves to identify those FI Corvettes as special. It became not uncommon to see crossed flags added to used '56-'57 Corvettes, even when incorrect, in later years. Even though my car was not fuel injected, my attitude was that it's my car and if I want to add cross flags, I'll do it (I did the same to my current '57). The only problem was that all my Corvette friends were NCRS members and gagged at the thought of this incorrect addition. You can imagine I really caught a ration of "you know what" for it. To get even with me they made up a story of the history and meaning of my crossed flags. According to them, the crossed flags were a rare performance option created by Zora Arkus-Duntov for select cars to make them go faster. My friends, without my knowledge, made a crossed flag gauge that would give you the increased performance readings. While they were on a trip to a Corvette Convention in Florida, they even took the gauge with them and had Duntov sign the back. It was at an NCRS meeting that my "friends" presented me with the Flag Gauge and their made-up gauge story. And that is why the Flag Gauge is so very special to me. It proves that my NCRS friends liked me more than they liked my car. The moral of this story is, don't ever look down your nose at what your friends do to their cars. You should cherish friendships and respect your friends, even if you don't feel the same about their cars.
