GIMMICK RALLEYE

Is there a better way to celebrate the end of a cold winter and the start of a warm spring than a Corvette Rallye? That's what a group of CCA members and Desert Corvette Association members did on Sunday, March 3. A total of 14 Corvettes started from Thorobred Chevrolet and followed a route through downtown Chandler, the Chandler Airport, out to Queen Creek and finishing at Floridino's Restaurant back in Chandler. Along the way participants looked for signs, counted traffic signals, looked for check points, and counted opportunities to turn. The rallye tested everyone's observation skills.

Two check points were used in the rallye; one near the Chandler Airport and the other in a shopping center in Queen Creek. At each check point, completed rallye forms were collected for the preceding leg and new forms issued for the new leg. This enabled checking rallye answers while the rallye continued. At the end of the rallye, participants turned in their final rallye form and were



issued a tie breaker questionnaire testing their memory of details of the rallye course. The questionnaire was only to be used in case of a tie in the total rallye scores.

Well guess what, there was a tie in the final rallye scores. Joe Hitzel/Jennifer McDonald, Jim/Esther Enriquez and Candy Cole/Denise Burk from DCA each had a score of 995 out of a total possible points of 1000, missing only one question during the entire rallye. More surprising, both Joe Hitzel/Jennifer McDonald, and Jim/Esther Enriquez had identical tie breaker scores. This necessitated going to the third level of tie breaking, which was a comparison of individual answers to questions on the tie breaking questionnaire. The winners were determined to be Joe Hitzel and Jennifer McDonald- by a hair.
