

We have some current members that will not be returning next year, sorry to see you leave.






CCA Driver to Prescott

Magical Mystery Tour





MMT started with drawing cards for a poker run as the MMT attendees received their first set of directions, a map and a short history of the first stop of MMT. With Fifteen vehicles we decided to have two groups of cars to help keep us together (Lovinos as the group leader one, Hagans group leader two, and Campises as the tail of group two). We tested the new radios and then embarked on first leg of MMT shortly at 7:00am.

Our first stop was Wickenburg, AZ. We stopped to give our legs a stretch. It was too early for DQ, although some probably could have wanted a taste or two of ice cream. 


