






Membership Report

The Pivars Craps Night at the Pivars

George Carlin once joked that "they banned me from the casino in Vegas for saying sh*t, when the big game played there is called 'craps.'" How did the popular dice game get its rather unsavory name? While craps is a distinctively American invention, it is based on a British dice game called Hazard that gained popularity some 2000 years ago. (Hazard is even mentioned by Chaucer in his Canterbury Tales.) When the French settled in what is now Nova Scotia, Canada, they brought the game of Hazard with them. In the mid-1700s, many of the French re-settled in New Orleans, where Hazard gained popularity thanks to all the gaming parlors in the area. The roll we now call "snake eyes" was referred to as "crabs" in the lingo of Hazard, and it is believed that over time "crabs" turned into "craps." Special thanks go to all who attended this very satisfying and worthwhile event.











Ducktail Spoiler Install

Several men, like me, guestioned if this spoiler was a good idea. A non-scientific poll of couples at a Corvette Club of Arizona meeting was 4:1 in favor. For the non-DIY people, skip to the final paragraph.

I got a paper template from the vendor and drilled four $\frac{1}{4}$ " holes. Unfortunately, the part did not easily bolt-on through any of these holes. The part by Racing Sports Concepts has 4 bolt mounts, while the Z51 factory spoiler has 6 connections.

Several steps are required to remove the back panel assembly. To remove the rear panel (bumper), you remove 16 T15 screws, 14 vertical and 2 horizontal screws in the corners.

I remove the rear wheels when working on the rear bumper panel. To protect the paint on the inside of the wheels, I lay a towel over the disk and caliper before using the torque wrench to remove the wheel. Then remove the rock guards with plastic pry tools after removing the 7mm (9/32" socket) screw on the bottom. Next remove four T15 wide-flange screws from the fender-liner material on each side to access the two 7mm screws and 10mm nut on each side that holds the panel to the body mounts. After a struggle and strains using hand wrenches, I bought a $\frac{1}{4}$ " right-angle drive drill to make the work less difficult. There are six 7mm screws that hold the lower bumper mounts to the body.






The APR Performance instructions I have say to disconnect the electrical connections to make the work easier. I never found a way to separate the connections. You must remove the six 7mm screws on each taillight to access the rear bolt hole on the spoiler.





Brennan Upgrade cont



As I started installing the bolts, I found that the spoiler position was not balanced side-to-side or front-to-back with any hole that I drilled through the template. The CF spoiler was also slightly twisted so I bought some longer 20 mm and 25 mm bolts to use as guide bolts.

I started an X-Y grid table to increase the size of the holes in my Corvette so the spoiler would be mounted evenly front to rear and side to side. Both holes on the driver side were a bit too far forward (about 1/16") and were too far apart. I assume that is why the vendor shipped 4 wide-flanged 6mm-1.00 -15mm bolts. The holes in the passenger side are spaced correctly, but they are about 1/8" too far from center, and also a bit too far forward.

After all the bolt holes aligned with the spoiler positioned correctly, you pull the plastic cover from the 3M tape. Then, you wipe the paint with adhesive accelerator. When the tape touches the finish, it sticks. You must carefully position the leading edge, dead center. Then, I rolled the spoiler back to contact the rear surfaces. Fortunately, the wide flange bolts provided by RSC threaded correctly.

Re-install the 12 taillight screws. Re-check the wiring connections and radar sensors as you re-hang the rear panel on the body. Check the alignment of the lower panel before tightening the upper screws. After the panel is installed, install the hardware under the body and in the fender wells and install the fender guards. Torque the wheels to 120 ft-lbs.

Installing this spoiler is not an easy job, it took me 4 days. My back hurt for 2 more days. It was more difficult than installing the IMSA diffuser. If you hire a shop to install this, expect a bill for 6 or more hours. I am glad that I finished the after-market aero package that I chose during my first year of ownership. The C8 is an amazing machine to look at and thrilling to drive.
