I attended the NCCC National February NCCC meeting in St. Louis, MO. The rule book changes did not pass last year. The committee came up with wording that is generic allowing the approval of the rule book in pieces or groups that are related. This will allow the governors to:

Vote no on a part that they don't like and vote yes on everything else. Final version should be in

NCCC is looking for a new company to provide championship rings. Use "Car Show" vs Concourse on flyers.

A trial for this year: trying to split top 15 into speed events and non-speed events and have top15 men and ladies in each category. Want to see how it works. Keep an open mind. Time trial change would allow three sanctioned events per session. Will be on the ballot in November.

Want input as to whether to keep record drags or continue with class drags and let individual tracks keep records. Not many participants. NCCC needs your input.

The business manager discussed new insurance. All flyers must include "Non-NCCC Members are not covered by NCCC Insurance". This requirement was also done in the past. When nonmembers become Corvette Enthusiasts, then they would be covered. Everyone MUST sign their own waiver. Do not sign in for someone else. In a past case, an official signature authenticator found that the document was signed by the spouse; the insurance did not pay. I reported that the new cars cannot have roll bars installed and will not be able to participate in races. Vicki said the GALA in Albuquerque was first rate; the hotel was superb; the trips were fun, and it was a top-rated event. Please pass accolades to all members planning the event. If you have a question pertaining to the insurance policy, the business manager requests that you read the policy on the NCCC website.

A motion was made by Ed Luse, seconded by Jim Zaborsky to adjourn the meeting.
