

Club turnout was wonderful; with a few very last minute cancellations, there were 50 of us (38 members and 12 guests).



Organ Stop Pizza is an AWESOME restaurant; they truly support the community! To accommodate small parties of >50 for a more intimate setting, the restaurant is closed to the public at lunch time. They welcomed CCA in style, by displaying our name on the marquis and opened the doors a few minutes early so we could get settled quickly. Two other parties were there but with a seating capacity of 700, we all had plenty of room to spread out and walk around. It felt like we had the entire restaurant to ourselves!

The OSP organ is the largest theater pipe organ ever created and its console rises above the audience on an 8,000 pound rotating hydraulic elevator to sit 10 feet above the 700 seat dining room.







The Organist, Brett Valliant is a virtuoso! He awed us with his talents, took time to explain how the organ is played and demonstrated how the various instruments scattered around the hall were sounded; announced special occasions and played special requests. For CCA, he performed several of our song requests, and gave a shout out for Frank Hagan's birthday, the Maioranos Anniversary, and the Katzes Anniversary. After these special announcements, Howard and I surprised everyone by serving cupcakes.

Maioranos

The 3 brief tours started with our shop and were intended to show a tie-in with Corvette history. As part of the Corvette history presentations books were given as a prize for the first correct response to Corvette quiz questions. Our shop does not have a Corvette in it but instead it has a '34 Chevrolet street rod, '68 Jaguar E-Type, and a '53 XK120 Jaguar. However, one of those cars represents the motivation and influence that led to the creation of the first Corvette in 1953.







Our garage does have 2 Corvettes in it, a 1957 and a 2007. The Corvette history presentation described how one of these cars represents a change in direction for the Corvette brand and how it would be marketed. It changed from merchandising a boulevard sports car to promoting a high-performance car equal or better than most competitors.

The library tour had memorabilia in it that included more Jaguar and Le Mans 24 Hours than Corvette. Again, the Corvette history presentation was about how an event at the 1955 Le Mans 24 Hours race impacted Chevrolet's decision to produce 1963 Corvette race cars intended to outperform the Shelby Cobra.

I don't recall everyone who was awarded a book, but I remember that Dennis Hughes, Mike Mileskiewicz, and Howard Katz were among the winners.

We think everyone enjoyed the opportunity to get together, socialize, and take-in a bit of Corvette history presented by an ex-Chevrolet Motor Division Merchandising Manager.
